 Marinas

Lake Powell boating facilities have had to make some changes to adjust to low water levels. Here's a summary of those changes and closures:

At Bullfrog Marina, all boat launching is done at your own risk. Dirt access roads lead to the ferry and to all launching facilities. Large vessels should be launched at Hall's Crossing.

Wahweap Marina has only its main launch ramp open. The Stateline public launch is closed.

Hite Marina is closed. All marina facilities have been relocated to other areas downstream. However, land-based facilities are still open.

Hall's Crossing is the least affected by low water. Its concrete boat launching facilities still have four lanes open. The John Atlantic Burr – the Lake Powell ferry that connects U-276 and Hall's Crossing to Bullfrog Marina – continues to operate.

Antelope Point Marina's public launch ramp is closed, but the area is still open for day use, and kayaks and canoes can still use the area.

Other details:

- 1** – Due to the narrowness of the channel and low water from Anchovy Point to Antelope Point Marina, boaters should be prepared for extra rough water there.
- 2** – Defiance House and Three Roof Ruins are inaccessible by water.
- 3** – Rainbow Bridge is now a 1.5-mile hike over land, from the courtesy dock, because of receding water.
- 4** – Castle Rock Cut is closed. Vehicle access to the lake is not possible at Dirty Devil, Farley, White Canyon or the North and South Bullfrog primitive camping areas. Vehicle access is also not possible at Crosby Canyon, but Lone Rock Beach is open for vehicle-accessible camping and day use.
